Important Dates

2024 Fall DMS Application Dates......October 1, 2023— February 1, 2024

January 15, 2024 is the "Early Admission" deadline for those who qualify.

Check the program web site for updated information on the application status.

To be eligible to submit an application to the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program, you must have successfully taken the NLN exam. See details below.

 The prerecorded information session will satisfy the meeting attendance requirement.
- The prerecorded online session includes one video. After viewing you will be asked to provide contact information and answer several questions to confirm your understanding of the material.
- For your application to be considered, attendance to an information meeting within the previous year is required.

Submit College Application and Fee

- Applicants who have not previously applied to Harper College need to complete this step first.

- Complete the Program Application (Diagnostic Medical Sonography) with a Valid National League for Nursing (NLN) Pre-Admission RN Exam Score Report

- The program application will only be available online during the published application windows.
- Those previously enrolled in the Diagnostic Sonography Degree Program will need Coordinator approval to submit another application.
- The application will require NLN Pre Admission RN Exam results to be uploaded.

<u>Valid NLN Pre-Admission RN Exam Report Minimums –</u> Each minimum must be met:

Minimum Score	NLN Score Report
Composite : 60 th percentile or higher	
Verbal : 40 th percentile or higher	Once scores are posted, check the section entitled RN Program Applicants for results.
Science: 40 th percentile or higher	The Composite, Verbal, Math and Science percentile scores are listed under the RN Percentile Rank.
Math: 40 th percentile or higher

- NOTE: Choose Harper as your school so results will be sent directly to Harper. Not doing so can delay processing of your application.
- Scores from an NLN Pre-Admission RN Test are valid for three years. (Refer to the chart later in this document for detailed information regarding expiration dates.)

Submit Additional Documentation

- Official High School Transcript OR GED Results The final high school transcript must have the graduation date posted; the GED report must show passing scores. The official transcript must be sent from the institution directly to Harper College (requests can typically be made at the institution website).
- Applicants who have completed high school in another country need to request an evaluation of their high school transcript through Educational Credential Evaluators, INC (ECE) https://www.ece.org/; or World Education Services (WES) https://www.wes.org/ and have this proof of U.S. High School Equivalency sent directly to Harper College.
- This high school requirement can be waived if official documentation is provided demonstrating completion of the equivalent of a U.S. associates degree or higher degree.
- Official Transcripts from other College's Attended Only required if an applicant wants Harper to consider courses taken at other institutions to fulfill DMS pre-requisite or program coursework.

- Official transcript must be sent from the institution(s) directly to Harper College. Requests can be made at the institution website or https://www.studentclearinghouse.org/students/.
- Foreign college transcripts must be evaluated by World Education Services https://www.wes.org/ or Educational Credential Evaluators, INC https://www.ece.org/ with a completed course-by-course evaluation sent directly to Harper College.
- Official transcripts received from other institutions are evaluated by the credentials analyst and posted on the student portal, as well as sent to the student's email address on record.

Program Prerequisites

Must be completed by the end of the semester in which the deadline falls

•	Harper Grade Point Average Current or previously enrolled Harper students must have a minimum 2.0 grade point average.
••	English Composition - ENG 101 at Harper College, or the equivalent from another college (as determined by the Harper College transcript evaluation). Must be completed with a grade of C or better. There is no expiration date on the English Composition course requirement.
•	Physics Course – PHY 100 (Basic Concepts in Physics) at Harper College, or the equivalent from another college (as determined by the Harper College transcript evaluation). This requirement can be satisfied by completion of PHY 121 or a higher-level physics course or PHY 110 (previously PHS 111) or the equivalent from another college (as determined by the Harper College transcript evaluation). The course must have a physics prefix or a physics course title in order to be considered; courses with titles such as "Science" or "Science and Technology" will not satisfy this requirement. Also, the course must have physics content as its focus in order to satisfy this physics admission requirement. Must be completed with a grade of C or better. There is no expiration date on the physics course requirement.
•	Human Anatomy - BIO 260 (previously 160) at Harper College, or the equivalent from another college (as determined by the Harper College transcript evaluation). Must be completed with a grade of C or better. There is a six-year time limit on the Human Anatomy course requirement. Refer to the chart following this section for details on expiration dates.
•	Human Physiology - BIO 261 (previously 161) at Harper College, or the equivalent from another college (as determined by the Harper College transcript evaluation). Must be completed with a grade of C or better. There is a six-year time limit on the Human Physiology course requirement. Refer to the chart following this section for details on expiration dates.
•	<u>Mathematics</u> – College Level Math (MTH 101, MTH 103, or higher college-level math, or the equivalent from another college (as determined by the Harper College transcript evaluation). MTH 165 (Elementary Statistics) at Harper College or the equivalent from another college is recommended. Must be completed with a grade of C or better.

There is no expiration date on the mathematics course requirement.

Re-entry Permission

 Those previously enrolled in a sonography program must have permission from the program coordinator to re-apply. Any applications submitted without coordinator approval are considered incomplete.

Admission Decisions

PLEASE NOTE: Satisfaction of admission requirements does not guarantee acceptance.

 Ranking scores will be calculated based on a point system with a maximum of 100 points; no points will be added to a ranking score for coursework completed <u>after</u> the application deadline. Ranking scores are calculated based on the following chart:

- Early Admission Option: To be eligible the applicant must meet specific conditions as follows:
 - Be a Harper College resident or a resident of a community college district that is a member of the CAREER Consortium and whose district does not offer the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program.
 - Completed application file all pre-requisite coursework finished, all documentation received, and spots available.
 - o Ranking score of <u>95</u> or higher
 - Completed application files must be received by January 15, 2024 and spots must be available
- Notification of acceptance will be sent to the Harper email and the email address provided on the application. Be sure to check spam folder when using personal email.
- <u>Standard Admission Option</u>: For those seats not filled through Early Admission: applicants that did not qualify for early admission or submitted their application after January 15, 2024
- Any seats available after the Early Admission window will be awarded seats based on ranking score and residency
- A minimum ranking score is identified. Those applicants whose ranking scores are at or above that minimum will be considered for acceptance or for placement on the alternate list.
- All applicants will be sent a decision to their Harper email and the email address provided on the application. Decision emails are typically sent 2-3 weeks after the application deadline date.

^{**}If you have taken and/or withdrew from BIO 260 (previously 160) and/or BIO 261 (previously 161) two (2) or more times before earning a C or better within the 6-year time limit, points will not be given toward the admission score.

(For example: 1st attempt: withdrew/D/F; 2nd attempt: withdrew/D/F; 3rd attempt: A, "NO" Points will be awarded)

- Admission will depend upon ranking score and residency
 - Harper College resident or a resident of a community college district that is a member of the CAREER Consortium that does not offer the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program are given priority consideration
 - Residency is determined by the address on record with the Harper Registrar's Office.
 - Working in district does not constitute residency for program acceptance.
- The program may remain open past the published deadline date of February 1, 2024
 - Any applicant meeting the minimum ranking score who applies after that date will be considered after all other applicants who have applied by the published deadline date.
 Applications will continue to be accepted until the program is closed. Check the DMS web site for information on the application status.
- Historically, previously admitted applicants have had more competitive overall admission scores (85 -100) and grades (A's and B's) in the pre-requisite science coursework.

Important Admission Notes

- It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that
 - o requirements are met and documentation submitted
 - emails and addresses are current with Harper's Registrar's Office and on the program application. Update information at <u>MyHarper Portal</u>
- Academic admission requirements must be met by the **end of the semester in which the deadline** falls, meaning by the end of the spring semester.
- Accepted applicants must be 18 years of age before the program starts.
- It can take several weeks for the College to receive transcripts from the sending institution. It may take the college several weeks to process the transcript once received. Once evaluated, an email is sent to the Harper email account. Results can be viewed through the MyHarper student portal. Questions about transcript evaluations can be sent to evaluation@harpercollege.edu
- Applicants not accepted into a program who wish to be considered in the selection process for a future term must attend a new information meeting and submit a new program application.
- Once your program application has been processed, you will be able to monitor your limited enrollment file online. Go to MyHarper Portal; limited enrollment information can be found under the Registration and Records section.
- Alternate lists do not carry over from year to year. Alternates not admitted to a program will need to attend a new program information meeting and submit a new program application for a future program start.
- Those from consortium districts who have been accepted into the program need to contact their college for a joint agreement to be brought to Harper's Registrar's Office. It is important that financial aid be made early to ensure timely registration and program success.
- Depending on the number of qualified applicants eligible for admission when admission decisions are
 made, it is possible that contingency offers may be extended to applicants who are in the process of
 completing an admission requirement (except for the NLN percentile minimums, which must be
 satisfied in order to submit a program application). When/If contingency offers are extended, the
 contingent requirement(s) must be satisfied within the semester in which the deadline falls. If the
 contingency is not met by the given date, the offer will be rescinded.
