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
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

Importance of HSIs

- Enhance academic success outcomes for underserved minority students, including Latine and Black students, through expanded academic support programs and professional development for faculty and studentfacing staff.
- Student programming that is culturally responsive and affirming based on a framework of servingness and belongingness.
- Provides a centralized resource point for Latine, Black, undocumented, mixedstatus, or minoritized students.

Improve the College's capacity to equitably evaluate initiatives to make data-informed decisions for leveraging fiscal resources for replication and scaling of successful initiatives.



Outcomes:

Academic, Institutional, and Fiscal:

- <u>Academic</u>- increased graduation and average credit accumulation rates and decreased stop-out rates for Hispanic, Black, and other underserved students.
- <u>Institutional</u> -improved teaching through culturally responsive pedagogies and practices that create a more welcoming and engaging learning environment.
- Improved equitable advising through culturally responsive advising practices;
- Increased student financial literacy leading to financial wellness
- <u>Fiscal</u>—Improve the College's capacity to equitably evaluate initiatives and make datainformed decisions about leveraging fiscal resources for replication and scaling successful initiatives.
