RECAP OF THE 57TH ANNUAL GRAMMY AWARDS

Sam Smith, Sam Smith, Sam Smith, Sam Smith. That was the name everybody around the world heard multiple times as he won four awards, including Best New Artist, Record of the Year and Song of the Year, and was nominated for six awards at the fifty-seventh Annual Grammy Awards. Oh, and he also performed a duet with Mary J. Blige of his international hit, "Stay With Me" – not too shabby for a newcomer. Sam won the

Pharrell Williams following with three each. The prestigious Lifetime Achievement award was given to George Harrison, The Bee Gees, Buddy Guy, and Flaco Jimenez. 25.3 million people tuned in to the show.

The show opened with Heavy Metal icons AC/DC performing their classic hits, "Rock or Bust" and "Highway to Hell", proving that even though they're all almost seniors they can still deliver highenergy performances. The second performance of the night was Ariana Grande who performed a slowed-down ballad version of her song, "Just a Little Bit Of Your Heart". Country songstress Miranda Lambert performed her Audra Mae cover of "Little Red Wagon", which was heavily censored on television. After a commercial break, president Barack Obama gave a PSA about domestic abuse towards women, which was followed by a speech by domestic abuse advocate Brooke Axtell. The following performance by Katy Perry of her song "By the Grace of God", was also dedicated to victims of domestic abuse, and was honestly one of the show's main highlights to me, even slightly outshining Perry's previous colorful performance at the Super Bowl.

Another memorable highlight performance was Pharrell Williams', who performed a reprise

most amounts of awards that night, Beyonce and rendition version of his monster-hit song "Happy" — which, honestly, I'm not a huge fan of — but this performance was groundbreaking. Sia's performance of her three-time-nominated smash "Chandelier" was just as strange as the music video for it, and Hozier's live performance of "Take Me to Church" was just as spine-chilling as the studio version of the song itself, if not more. And then of course we have Kanye West's two performances: one being his autotuned balled, "Only One", told from the perspective of his deceased mother looking down on him and his daughter, and the epic "FourFiveSeconds" featuring Rihanna and on guitar Sir Paul McCartney. The last performance of the night was by John Legend and Common with their Golden Globewinning balled from the Selma soundtrack, "Glory". All these live performances were excellent, but out of all of them, the hardest hitting performance was by none other than the Queen of Pop herself, Madonna. She performed her brand new song, "Living for Love", wearing a matador outfit, surrounded by men dressed as Minotaurs, and stunning laser light effects.

The album was under a lot of pressure, being the first release the band has had after their decade long indefinite-hiatus. The reunion and new release was a huge surprise and the album proved to be something of a

hit for fans of the band. The album has some of Sleater-Kinney's best songs. The album keeps some of the defining factors of the sound of Sleater-Kinney yet it adds something new that in the end makes the perfect mix of an album.

The band, Carrie Brownstein, Corin Tucker and Janet Weiss, have all been busy during the hiatus. Carrie Brownstein formed Wild Flag, along with Janet Weiss. Carrie also has been known to be the star of the IFC show Portlandia. Corin Tucker has been raising a family as well as forming the band Cadallaca. Janet Weiss also being one half of Quasi since its birth and as well as playing drums with Stephen Malkmus and the Jicks.



From the get go the album tears your head off. The album kicks off with "Price Tag" which kicks down the door and announces itself. The song starts off with this doubling octave up menacing riff which is joined with ringing open chords and this grooving latin-esque drums. The song's lyrics sort of plays with the topic of working. The lyrics "its 9am, we must clock in, the system waits for us" which speaks of their hiatus and comeback for this album.

"Fight's over, but I'll fight on" which is a lyric from the song "Fangless" which one might think is an introspective perspective to the current state of the band, more specifically what the purpose of this album is. The song features some of the catchiest guitar parts and chorus within the album and perhaps all of Sleater-Kinney's extensive discography. The lyrics "No one here is taking notice, no outline will ever hold us" from "A New Wave" talks about being pigeon holder as a certain type of band and in many ways they did "Invent our own kind of obscurity" as the song mentions.

...The Album of the Year award went to Beck's album Morning Phase (which also won Best Rock Album), which took many by surprise, specifically Kanye West, who "jokingly" attempted to mimic his stunt at the 2009 MTV VMAs where he snatched the award from Taylor Swift, saying that Beyonce deserved it instead, but this time Kanye pulled back and smiled and everyone thought he was just joking around. But after the show at the after party, Kanye told E! that he wasn't joking and that Beyonce's 2013 album should've won instead of Beck.

The Best Rock Performance award went to Jack White's hit song "Lazaretto", and Best Rock Song went to Paramore's "Ain't It Fun" (their first Grammy). The Best R&B Performance and the Best R&B Song awards both went to Beyonce & Jay-Z's smash hit "Drunk in Love". Kendrick Lamar took home the Best Rap Performance and Best Rap Song awards for his single "I", and Eminem won Best Rap Album for his eighth studio album

The Marshall Mathers LP 2, and the Best Rap/Sung Collaboration award for his 2013 collaboration with Rihanna, "The Monster".

The Best Country Solo Performance award went to Carrie Underwood's single "Something in the Water", and the Best Country Album award went to Miranda Lambert for her album Platinum.

Overall I'd say this was the best Grammys award show in recent years. Great performances, and for the most part, a majority of the winners deserved to win. The only complaints I have about the show are that a lot of major awards (including all the Rap related ones) weren't shown live, instead they were given out during the Premiere Ceremony, which wasn't broadcasted live; 70 awards were given out during this ceremony. I know the Grammys have a limited timeslot, but they could've squeezed in a few of the important categories that weren't presented live

And also the fact that host LL Cool J barely showed his face during the whole show, not to mention that this is the fourth year in a row he's hosted; he isn't a terrible host but he's pretty much overstaying his welcome. But aside from those minor issues, the fifty-seventh Annual Grammy Awards was a night to remember (and is still being talked about on social media today even though it happened weeks ago).

Jeff Samardzija was lost to the cross town White Sox but they gained even more when All-Star Jon Lester signed up. Lester has come to town to win a World Series. He can't do it himself.

The starting five is looking to be in no particular order, Jon Lester, Jason Hammel, Travis Wood, Edwin Jackson, and Jake Arrieta. The bullpen doesn't have any big name stars, but if the starting pitching is anything as promised, then it will just have to be average.

Sporting News has the Cubs winning the World Series. So does Robert Zemeckis. If they want to go that far, they are going to have to play perfect ball all year. We all know that will be extremely hard. But times are changing. If this year is any success, expect them to be in contention next year.

WHITE SOX: What to expect...

The Sox went all in this past offseason. They could have had the bets offseason of any team. They dumped Adam Dunn last year, which made this all possible.

The Sox filled Dunns place and more by signing Adam LaRoche, Melky Cabrera, David Robertson, Jeff Samardzija, Zach Duke, and Emilio Bonifacio, and Dan Jennings. The starting pitching should be great as Cy Young candidate Chris Sale leads the pack again. Sale has been in Cy Young contention the past 3 years, but injuries have always taken him out of it.

Sale continues to get better every year. Jose Quintana can be the number two in the rotation after John Danks continues to struggle since his Tommy John surgery. Quintana is a very consistent pitcher and will be a solid contributor. New addition Jeff Samardzija from the Cubs will fit in somewhere in the three to four spot in the rotation.

The four and five spot will either belong to John Danks or Hector Noesi. Danks is still trying to find his game since surgery 3 years ago. His consistency has been all butt taken from him since.

If he starts out poor again, he could be gone by mid-season. Overall the Sox have 3-4 starters who can all go up to 200+ innings. If that happens expect the bullpen to have an easy job. The bullpen was the major problem last season.

The Sox lost 40+ games after leading past the 7th inning last season and 16 after leading past the 8th. Chop that number in half and they are in the playoffs. That means the offense isn't a problem and probably won't b after the additions of power in the lineup.

The bullpen has changed for the better, at least on paper. Closer David Robertson from the Yankees has joined as well as Zach Duke and Dan Jennings. Nate Jones should be back by mid-summer after suffering from Tommy John surgery last year.

Jessie Crain signed a minor league deal in January. He has biceps surgery a year and a half ago. The bullpen can't be any worse than last year. They were the second worse in the AL. Given the renovations in both starting pitching and the bullpen, the pitching could be one of the best in the league. There is not much to say about the offense, as we all know what it is capable of doing.

Sluggers Jose Abreu and Avasail Garcia are back and looking to crush the ball. The infield is going to look the same except at second base. Carlos Johnson and Micah Johnson are looking to make a run for it while veteran Gordon Beckham will be more of an insurance role. Newcomer Adam LaRoche will be switching off at first base with Abreu, making it a very dangerous position to pitch to.

Connor Gillaspie will be at third while Alexie Ramirez will most likely remain at shot stop. Adam Eaton, Melky Cabrera, Avasail Garcia, and Emilio Bonifacio will be taking the positions. Tyler Flowers will also remain at the catcher position.

Overall, on paper, the Sox have one of the most talented teams. In reality it is yet to be determined what will make or break this team.

Every comic fan boy's dream has come true. Spider-Man is going to be a part of the Marvel Cinematic Universe. Marvel and Sony have worked out a deal which would lease his rights and incorporate him with the likes of Iron Man, Captain America, Thor, and the rest of the MCU characters.

According to sources, the transaction was free. Marvel isn't paying anything to Sony to use the rights. They are basically leasing the character. Marvel won't be earning any box office money off of Sony's Spidey films and neither will Sony be gaining any money the Marvel movies that star Spider-Man. The character will first be cast in one of Marvel's movies (reportedly Captain America: Civil War) and then have his own stand-alone movies that could feature characters from the MCU. Marvel head boss Kevin Feige will be producing the standalone movies that Sony will be making. In the end, Sony still has final say over casting and creative control.

Ever since Marvel started their Cinematic Universe, fans everywhere desperately wanted

Spidey to be included. It seems both companies listened. Marvel gave the cinematic rights to the web-slinger to Sony in 1999 for financial reasons. Sony made three films and rebooted the series into another two.

When Marvel began making their own movies it seemed impossible for them to get the rights back. At the time, Sony was fresh off of making their first three Spider-Man movies and were planning on rebooting the whole series. They were smashing box office records and were not ready to give the rights back. Marvel was desperate to get the rights back. Reports were stating that Marvel was offering billions of dollars to regain full control of his rights. As the time passed, things looked bleak.

News broke about a month ago stating that there were talks between Marvel and Sony to somehow instate a deal about whether or not Marvel could get the rights back.


The deal comes at somewhat a surprise because within the past couple of months, Marvel released the plans for Phase Three of their Cinematic Universe. With this new deal, Marvel has



5.) Fall of United: Manchester United 2013-2014 season

1.) Deutschland, Die Weltmeister: Germany v. Argentina, 2014 FIFA World Cup





But to hold us off until then and to declare his possible departure from Cash Money Records, Drake randomly released If You're Reading This It's Too Late, out of the blue and without warning (as did Beyoncé in 2013). On Twitter, Drake declared If You're Reading This It's Too Late as a mixtape, although unlike most mixtapes today, it is not a free download, it was released onto iTunes for the normal price of an album, and the entire tape was recorded in a studio and contains 17 original songs. The album was released on Feb. 13, the six year anniversary of his mixtape So Far Gone, which is the mixtape that put Drake on the map as a major artist. Later last December, Lil Wayne, Drake's mentor and the CEO of Young Money Entertainment, went on a Twitter rampage declaring his anger for Cash Money CEO, Birdman, for keeping Wayne from releasing his long-awaited for album, *Tha Carter V*. Wayne ranted how he was feeling imprisoned by the label and that he wants out of his deal with Cash Money, which he has been signed to since the early 90s. Wayne is currently in a legal battle with Birdman and Cash Money, threatening to sue for \$51 million dollars, for him to be able to leave Cash Money, and take all of Young Money with him, including Nicki Minaj and Drake. It is also rumored that Cash Money owes Drake several unpaid royalties.

If You're Reading This It's Too Late shows an angrier, more ignorant (or as Hip Hop fans say, "ignant") side of Drizzy, as well as a few emotional tracks, which Drake is known most for. The album's closing track, "6PM In New York", is an all-out attack on the recent enemies Drake's made the past few years, with lines attacking fellow Young Money rapper Tyga ("You need to act your age and not your girl's age" referring to Tyga's relationship with seventeen year old Kylie Jenner), Hip Hop mogul Diddy ("Real quick, man, you couldn't've hated that, let's be real, you couldn't've made it that" referring to Diddy claiming that Drake's producers stole the instrumental to Drake's hit song "0-100" from Diddy), and even rapper Kendrick Lamar ("They gonna say your name on them airwaves, they gonna hit you after like it's only rap" referring to Kendrick "attacking" Drake and others on his infamous collaboration track "Control", which caused a lot of controversy). Every album and mixtape Drake has released thus far consists of both rapping and R&B-style singing, both pretty much equally distributed 50/50 on each album and mixtape, but besides the soulful "Jungle", the haunting "Company", and the chilling "Now & Forever", If You're Reading This It's Too Late consists mainly of all Hip Hop influenced tracks.

We get more of "ignant" Drizzy on the fiery tracks "6 God", which is rapped over high-powered trumpet-like synchs, "10 Bands", "6 Man", and "No Tellin'", the Lil Wayne featured "Used To" (originally on Lil Wayne's recent mix tape Sorry For The Wait 2), and the chill-flowed album opener "Legend". On these tracks, Drake is a happy-go-lucky rapper while at the same time rapping about his inner struggles and unleashing his inner demons on the mica. The most emotional track on the album is "You & The 6", which is told in the perspective of Drake having a phone call with his mother, telling her about his relationship issues, pretty much everything he's been dealing with ever since he became famous, and also discusses his relationship with his father.

If You're Reading This It's Too Late I would say is the album Drake was meant to make. It's overall sound is a strange fusion of everything he's done thus far, specifically So Far Gone and Nothing Was The Same, and more. He also gives some shine to his latest OVO Sound signee, PARTYNEXTDOOR. If this truly is Drake's departure album from Cash Money, then he couldn't have done better. Features on the album include Lil Wayne, PARTYNEXTDOOR, and Travi\$ Scott. Highlight tracks include "6PM in New York", "You & The 6", "Legend", and "Star67".

"The Blacker the Berry" the Sweeter the Juice


Compton rapper, Kendrick Lamar released a new song titled "The Blacker the Berry" on Feb. 9, the day after he had won two Grammys for his song, "I". "I", a positive, uplifting anthem that encourages self-love in the face of adversity, is the leading single on Lamar's upcoming album. Right away, it was received with very split opinions: the listeners who applauded Lamar for being versatile and those who thought it was a hokey Kid Cudi-esque mess.

If you ask me, "I" left much to be desired. I was just kind of left sitting there, like, "Is this it? Is this really the 'genius' single that Kendrick's been sitting on his high horse working on for months?" It was weak on all of Lamar's strong points: sample choice, storytelling, flow. Still, I gave it the benefit of the doubt, hoping it was just his "radio song", but then the radio stations didn't pick it up, either. If Kendrick Lamar's album were the cast of Fresh Prince of Bel-Air, then "I" would be Carlton and "The Blacker the Berry" would be Jazzy.

Just in the manner that "The Blacker the Berry" was released, it was clear that Lamar was making a statement. It was up the day following a very controversial night at the Grammys for the Hip Hop community. Albums that many felt were sure to be winners were snubbed of even a nomination, and not one Hip Hop award was televised. None of this went unnoticed, especially by artist Azealia Banks, who tweeted: "If that wasn't a mayonaise on wonderbread sandwich with a glass of milk I saw..." about the award show, right after questioning whether any of the rap Grammys were shown at all (@ AZEALIABANKS). Complex even went as far as "examining how the Grammys have typically snubbed rap's most prolific players, or misrepresented the genre altogether". Considering last year's infamous snub of Kendrick Lamar's good kid, m.A.A.d city in favor of Macklemore's... whatever it was that Macklemore put out... and this year's inclusion of Iggy Azalea as a contender for Best Rap Album, there was a lot of talk of the Hip Hop community boycotting the award show altogether. It really doesn't help that the only other white person in the category, Eminem, won for The Marshall Mathers LP 2. C'mon. It was a terrible album.

However, neither Kendrick Lamar nor anyone else from Top Dawg Entertainment was in attendance that night regardless of Lamar's wins for both Best Rap Performance and Best Rap Song. Instead, I'd like to think they were just chillin', mastering "The Blacker the Berry". I'd like to think that releasing the song the day after skipping the Grammys is TDE's way of saying "Hey, guys, we're serious about this hip hop thing."

"The Blacker the Berry" is such a powerful song for so many reasons. Simply having Assassin on the hook strengthens the song's overall aggressive tone and supports the cultural theme, as Lamar seems to be exploring what it means to be "African-American". The Grammys were probably the furthest thing from Lamar's mind when he was writing this song, because it sounds



less like a hit and more like a lyrical masterpiece. He delivers his argument (because I think that's truly the purpose of the song) in such an articulate way, even for Lamar, that it left me speechless on the first listen.

Lamar makes a lot of bold allusive choices, among them: "I'm the

biggest hypocrite of 2015", which could be in reference to an earlier interview he had with *Billboard*. For background, when everyone's attention was on the events surrounding Michael Brown's death at the hands of a police officer in Ferguson, MO, and seemingly everyone was coming together and offering support to the black community, Lamar controversially asked, "How can they respect us if we don't respect ourselves?" Other black artists were quick to criticize the flawed and potentially dangerous logic behind a statement like this, as well as the harm having a well-known rapper blatantly ignore the effects of systemic racism during a time of social crisis. Apparently Lamar hasn't backed down on his opinion, though, because his last verse on "The Blacker the Berry" shamelessly compares the gang violence between the Crips and the Pirus to two warring African tribes.

One of the most strongest lines of the song, still, would be: "I'm African-American, I'm African/ I'm black as the moon, heritage of a small village/Pardon my residence/ Came from the bottom of mankind/ My hair is nappy, my d*** is big, my nose is round and wide/ You hate me don't you?/ You hate my people, your plan is to terminate my culture/ You're f**** evil, I want you to recognize that I'm a proud monkey."

Lamar attacks the oppression of black Americans with similar, powerful language and a confrontational tone for two verses, and then shifts his focus for the third. It feels like he does a complete one-eighty right when you're vibin'; Lamar implies that while police brutality and racism are problems that deeply affect black communities, they're hypocrites for contributing to the violence within their communities themselves. It's actually not entirely implicit — he yells, "Hypocrite!" And that's where I both have a problem with Lamar's motives and completely respect him for defending his point in such a moving way.

So, Kendrick Lamar: Compton rapper or social activist? I don't think Lamar has offered any answers to our country's race problems, but I will say that he's doing more to solve them than any other prominent rapper in the hip hop community right now — he's forcing us to talk about it. No matter what he does nowadays, Kendrick Lamar gets people talking. Whether it be in the context of how raw his flow is on this song, or how good his verses progress, what we talk about when we talk about "The Blacker the Berry" spans more than the five minutes of the song.

All in all, it was a brilliant song. Unlike "I", it feels like something so genuinely Kendrick Lamar. Even if you liked "I" (I mean, it did win two Grammys...), "The Blacker the Berry" leaves fans hopeful that the rest of the still-unnamed album will be much sweeter.

MY VIEW: GOVERNOR RAUNER'S BUDGET IS NOT A SOLUTION TO ILLINOIS'S PROBLEMS, IT ONLY ADDS TO THEM

It's no secret that Illinois has a tradition of, shall we say, "ethically and/ or competency challenged" governors. It's a big reason as to why the state's finances are so out of whack and why investment in the state is considerably lower than our neighbors. Hoping to reverse this trend, the people of traditionally democratic Illinois elected Bruce Rauner, a hyper-successful republican businessman, to the governorship this past November. When he ran, Bruce's speeches didn't really offer specific policy proposals or solutions to the problems of Illinois, but they just sounded good, especially to people who grew tired of his fairly uncharismatic predecessor Pat Quinn. Bruce Rauner's plan was to shake up Springfield. He didn't necessarily say how he was going to do that, but damn it, he was going to shake up Springfield one way or another. Last week he finally had a chance to do that, for the worse.

In late February, Governor Rauner unveiled his 2016 budget for Illinois, and in it were enormous spending cuts that amounted to about 1.5 billion dollars. Among the items cut were funding for Medicaid, public transit, Chicago's budget, and public universities and colleges in the state. In addition to the austerity-filled budget, Rauner made a proposal to move Illinois's public employees, like teachers, from a pension plan into a privatized 401-K type system, which essentially cheats these employees out of the money they put into their own retirement system. Not surprisingly, some things that were absent from his budget included any mentions of tax increases for the wealthy or any closings of tax loopholes for corporations or the wealthiest one percent of Illinois's citizens. If you ask me, what Governor Rauner seems to be forgetting is that simply because he won the governorship in an overwhelmingly blue

state, that does not mean that the population of the state switched over to the Republican Party as a result. The Governor's budget has outraged many people. Some of them include, but are not limited to the following:

- House Speaker and Illinois Democratic Party Chairman Michael Madigan (D-Chicago), who favors imposing a "millionaire's tax" on Illinois's wealthiest citizens. He also presides over a democratic supermajority in the house that could override any veto that the Governor places on his legislation
- Senate President John Cullerton (D-Chicago), who is opposed to such dramatic cuts in the state's safety net as well as the dismantling of the pension system. Like Madigan, Cullerton also has a verto-proof democratic majority in the senate. Together, this gives him and Madigan the ability to override any vetoes from the governor and write their own bills into law.
- Attorney General Lisa Madigan, daughter of Michael, who has been critical of Rauner's recent anti-labor policies, viewing them as unconstitutional under Illinois law
- Chicago Mayor Rahm Emanuel, who is embittered towards the Governor for his cutting of funds to the city
- The students and families of Illinois's public universities and community colleges, who will likely have to see an increase in tuition costs due to the decrease in state funding.
- Commuters who depend on Metra and the CTA who will also be likely to see fares increase

Rauner made his budget under the guise of it being "business-friendly", that the spending cuts and low tax rate will draw in more commerce to the state. If you ask me, Rauner's plan for Illinois is business friendly much like how an injured zebra is lion friendly. I never fell into the belief that corporations or the ultra-wealthy need to be coddled by the state out of fear of their departure. If the Governor is serious about Illinois's economic rebound, he needs to help solve the state's revenue problem, and that means raising taxes and closing loopholes as well as cutting spending. On the ballot last November, there was a non-binding initiative to increase the tax rate on Illinois's wealthiest citizens, and it passed overwhelmingly. If Rauner wants to be the peoples' governor, turning their votes into law would be a phenomenal place to start. Another thing that would help would be for the Governor to be open to a wage increase without any major caveats. Ask any economist, in a consumptionbased economy, like the one in the U.S., fiscal growth is dependent upon the spending capacity of its consumers, and many of those consumers work for minimum wage. If he's serious about improving Illinois's GDP growth and overall economy, it is vital that Governor Rauner make a substantial wage increase a priority.

After looking over his budget and proposals, my question to Governor Rauner is simply, what the Hell were you thinking? You barely beat an unpopular governor, and you assume that gives you a mandate to do whatever you want? Simply because a majority of a minority of Illinois's citizens elected you to be governor, that does not mean that the state suddenly turned red overnight. You have a legislature that can vote their own bills into law without your pen, an Attorney General eyeing your moves like a hawk, the contempt and ire of virtually every union in the state, and a relatively liberal electorate who is unwilling to stomach such drastic cuts to their essential services. Why would you think that you could pick a fight with these people and expect to come out on top? My advice to you Governor Rauner is to learn how to play ball with the other leaders of the state. True, you were elected to your position fair and square, but so were they, and the people of this state want you to work with them instead of against them. Illinois is very much a progressive state, and its people will not tolerate such a blatant arch-conservative agenda being pushed down their throats. If you want to shake up Springfield, you need to shake off the partisanship first.

AMERICA IN PRIMETIME: THE INDEPENDENT WOMAN



I recently stumbled upon this four-part documentary series developed by The Documentary Group that was originally developed for PBS. The series was entitled America In Primetime which aired in 2011. It was a show about these TV archetypes that were prominent in primetime television. And each episode was focused on a different TV archetype -- like the man of the house, the independent woman, the misfit and the crusader.

The great thing about the series is that they go into detail, they examine them, and we just happen to be there witnessing it. The show explains things in a way and in the mindset that we the viewers are intellectual and that we can comprehend these dissections of these TV types and it's done in a very entertaining way.

This got me really interested in diving into this whole research and reflection about these archetypes in Television, but more than that these archetypes have been around for just about every piece of literature or storytelling.

The second archetype I'll be discussing is the "Independent Woman".

Right around the time that the "Man of The House" archetype was changing another archetype was emerging; the character that is the "Independent Woman". The woman steered away from being the one dimensional Housewife to being complex and even controversial and challenging characters.

Society always asked a lot of the Woman character portrayed in Television. She had to be the perfect woman, she had to present a perfect image, to be the perfect wife, the perfect mom. It was such a high standard that was never really the reality. It presented a lot of pressure for woman.

Early on in Television the woman character always had a lot of pressure. Always served the husband and made them feel like nothing was wrong ever. The Independent Woman was being hinted in I Love Lucy who was relentless, she wanted excitement in her life but she was stuck being a housewife. Lucy never did stop trying even if she was always put down by Rudy.

The Dick Van Dyke show really thrust something into the realm of Television. They were making the wife more of an "Independent Woman". The character of Laura, played by Mary Tyler Moore was written by Carl Reiner to not be "the

kind of wife who says 'here's the cream and sugar, darling and how was your day?" as mentioned in the documentary series. Laura had a true presence and identity which was missing from the portrayal of women on television at the time. Though the character

The "Independent Woman" came into more prominence with the Mary Tyler Moore Show. Mary Tyler Moore who play Dick Van Dykes wife in the Dick Van Dyke show became sort of more interesting. In the Mary Tyler Moore show Mary Tyler Moore plays a working career woman who was never divorced and was never married. The idea was to have a woman be independent yet terrified at the same time. The show shattered the stereotype.

The independent woman got stronger and stronger. In the show Murphy Brown the main character Murphy was a 40 year old career woman, who just recently got out of rehab, who was interesting, and not likable. This was unheard of on television at the time, it was unusual at the time to have a woman be portrayed to not have any interesting in being liked.

Roseanne was the first to show a woman actually running the family which was never shown on television. Everyone knew that mothers ran the family yet it was never shown on TV. The center of the show was a working woman who had to take control of raising the family. The show really showed the real family, it wasn't perfect, it was a struggle, it was a show that showed that there bad things happen in families, this all gave the show an edge.

There was another landscape that was opening up in more recent years. Which was making TV shows on paid cable networks like HBO and so on. Being on cable TV had more freedom than network. They didn't have to rely a lot on advertising money, ratings was not a huge factor, they were not pressured to have to cater to everyone, they could be a more focused show they could show things and say things that you couldn't say on network.

One of the shows that came from cable TV that highlighted the independent woman was Sex and the City. Carrie was a career woman who "fooled around" and unapologetically did so. It was four independent friends in New York City.

In Desperate Housewives which also showed reality much like Roseanne did. They showed characters who hated being mothers, women who had a hard time. They talked about something that was never talked about on television. It showed women flawed characters which was not unseen, but it was put on to the character of the housewife and a lot of people were surprised.

The evolution of the woman, but really with any TV character is really sort of a retroactive one. We started out with these clear cut, one dimensional perfect characters. They developed into more complex, multi-dimensional, flawed, realistic characters. Woman are not expected to be anything on TV anymore, women don't have to be stuck in a certain stereotype, and there is more allowance of nuances. This is what is beautiful about the landscape of television now every channel you switch to will have a completely different character on it. The landscape has been busted open and it has birthed unlimited possibilities for the archetype of the independent woman.




